Fall 2011

The undergraduate enrollment of 2,088 includes 500 new freshmen and 163 new transfer students for Fall 2011. There are 27 students classified as Post-Baccalaureate or Non-Degree Seeking. Demographically, almost sixty-six percent (1,370) of the undergraduates are female, and sixty-eight percent (1,416) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-eight percent of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 1,993 (95.5%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 73 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 85.3% of undergraduates. Ninety-one percent are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, sixty-two percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1092 and 23 for the ACT examination. Approximately 18% of undergraduates have declared a major in Biology, while 14% have declared Nursing and nine percent Psychology.

Fall 2010

The undergraduate enrollment of 2,198 includes 516 new freshmen and 206 new transfer students for Fall 2010. There are 23 students classified as Post-Baccalaureate or Non-Degree Seeking. Demographically, almost sixty-six percent (1,445) of the undergraduates are female, and sixty-five percent (1,429) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-nine percent of undergraduates.

For students with known addresses, 2,120 (97.7%) have Texas as their state of permanent address, representing 67 counties. Students from Harris, Fort Bend, and Brazoria county make up 86.5% of undergraduates. Ninety percent are U.S. citizens.

Among students who reported a high school class ranking, fifty-seven percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The mean score for undergraduates for the SAT is 1085 and 23 for the ACT examination. Approximately 17% of undergraduates have declared a major in Biology, while 15% have declared Nursing and nine percent Psychology.

Test Score Calculations

For students with both an SAT and ACT score, only one score is counted. The ACT score is converted into the equivalent SAT score and compared to the actual SAT score, and only the higher is retained. Additionally, for students with multiple SAT test scores, the highest verbal and math subscores (from any test date) are added to get the student's final SAT score.

Prior to Fall 2007, SAT scores were reported using Recruitment PLUS. Recruitment PLUS converted all ACT scores to an equivalent SAT score, and included the converted scores in the final mean.
