### **Fall 2011**

The graduate student enrollment of 344 includes 102 students who entered the University in Summer 2011 or Fall 2011. Demographically, seventy-two percent (246) of the graduate students are female, and more than half (174) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up twenty-eight percent of the group. Ninety-two percent of the students are U.S. citizens.

Forty-nine percent of the graduate students are classified as full-time. The three largest graduate programs are the Master of Education, Master of Business Administration, and the Master of Science in Human Resource Management, with approximately 26%, 18%, and 17% of all graduate students, respectively.

### **Fall 2010**

The graduate student enrollment of 399 includes 128 students who entered the University in Summer 2010 or Fall 2010. Demographically, 73% (293) of the graduate students are female, and 52% (206) are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation make up 30% of the group. Ninety-three percent of the students are U.S. citizens.

Forty-two percent of the graduate students are classified as full-time. The three largest graduate programs are the Master of Education, Master of Business Administration, and the Master of Science in Human Resource Management, with approximately 30%, 18%, and 17% of all graduate students, respectively.

1. Test score data is not generally entered into Banner for graduate students, so test scores are not included in this report. Additionally, most graduate students list their permanent address as their local address, so state and county information is not included as in the other profiles.
